The Supervisor called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

R. Moskal, 5215 Prairie Creek Ct., brought a complaint before the board regarding a neighbor noise problem. Moskal stated there is loud stereo music being played from a garage daily from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. The Bay County Sheriff himself has been to the residence 4 times but there is nothing he can do. Moskal asked the board for assistance.

The Supervisor responded that he spoke with Bay County legal council and was told the county noise ordinance is not valid and cannot be enforced due to an attorney general opinion that the county cannot regulate city or township properties. Malkin did state the township could adopt a noise ordinance that the Sheriff Deputy could enforce.

County Commissioner V. Begick stated he spoke with the prosecuting attorney who confirmed that the county ordinance is only valid and enforceable on county owned property. Public Input closed at 7:14 p.m.
