A letter was received from County Executive J. Barcia dated September 17, 2020, and received by the township on October 13, 2020, inviting the township to opt-in to the new Bay County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority.

# RESOLUTION CONSENTING TO OPT-IN FOR INCLUSION OF MUNICIPALITY IN BAY COUNTY BROWNFIELD REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (BRA)

WHEREAS, the Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Act, being Act 381 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1996, as amended (the "Act"), authorizes the County of Bay to establish a Brownfield Redevelopment Authority; and

WHEREAS, Brownfield Redevelopment Authorities are eligible for state grants and loans for projects that promote economic development and revitalization of brownfield properties through environmental assessment, cleanup or blight elimination; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Bay County Commissioners under Resolution 2020-027 has determined that it is in the best interest of the County to establish and provide for the operation of a Brownfield Redevelopment Authority ("Authority") pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Authority shall exercise its power a provided by the Act over property located within the boundaries of the County, provided that the Authority does not exercise its power over property located within a city, village or township located in the County unless such city, village or township has adopted a resolution concurring to the inclusion of such property; and

WHEREAS, the Local Unit has determined that it is in the best interest of the Local Unit to join the Authority, so it permits property located within its municipal boundaries to be included in the Bay County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The Local Unit hereby agrees to opt into the Authority so that property located within its municipal boundaries shall be included under the Brownfield Redevelopment Authority the County of Bay.
- 2. The Township Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Bay County Clerk.
- 3. All resolution and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby rescinded.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 67, AS AMENDED, TO REZONE CERTAIN PROPERTIES WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

#### THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF MONITOR ORDAINS:

#### SECTION I

Monitor Township Ordinance 67, designated "Monitor Township Zoning Ordinance", effective March 25, 2019 and the zoning district map, attached thereto and made a part thereof, are hereby amended by re-zoning the following described property in the Charter Township of Monitor, Bay County, Michigan, from R-3 (Medium Density Multiple Family Residential District) to  ${\tt C}$  (Commercial).

# Location for Rescue Vehicle

The Fire Chief in a letter to the board dated October 23, 2020, stated the Rescue vehicle will not fit into the back shed (pole barn) with the other fire vehicles.

Chief Kramer outlined two options for the board to consider to correct this problem.

Option 1 – To build a fourth roll up style garage door at the west end of the back shed and move the man door to the east side of the building. This will cost between \$10,000 and \$15,000 for engineering and design which is required by code. This option would allow the fire department to temporarily store the rescue truck in the heated pole barn with the other fire vehicles. This door would be useful to the township after the fire department is finished with the temporary use.

Option 2 – To purchase a portable garage unit which must be at least 13x24x10 in size. This unit can be placed outside the shed in the back to keep the rescue truck out of the elements and still ready to respond. It must be secured to the ground and heated to keep the Rescue truck ready for immediate response by utilizing a portable heater fan. Kramer predicts this could be costly during the cold winter and the constant running of the fan. The cost of a portable garage unit ranges from \$1000 to 1500. A portable heater will cost between \$100 and \$350 depending on the style and coverage and not be useful to the township after the fire department moves into the new station.

Of the two options, Chief Kramer recommends Option 1.

Motion by Reder supported by Malkin to approve the Fire Chief's October 23, 2020 recommendation to add a fourth roll up door to the north pole barn and move the man door to the west end of the pole barn to allow for the temporary storage of the Rescue vehicle at an estimated design and engineering cost of \$10,000 to \$15,000.

RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO AMEND SPECIAL ASSESSMENT ROLL REGARDING MONITOR TOWNSHIP TRASH PICKUP SERVICE, AND TO HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING SAME

WHEREAS, on August 24, 1998, a Resolution of Intent to Proceed After Public Hearing was adopted, which Resolution established a Township wide special assessment district for trash pick-up, and

WHEREAS, the special assessment roll of all parcels in the Township to be included in the special assessment district was confirmed by the Monitor Township Board after public hearing held September 14, 1998, and

WHEREAS, the Township has executed a Township Wide Residential Trash Removal Agreement to effectuate the trash pick-up program, and

WHEREAS, it has now become necessary to add as many as twenty-five (25) parcels and delete as many as fourteen (14) parcels from the special assessment roll as originally adopted, and

WHEREAS, any amendment to a confirmed special assessment roll for any special assessment district created pursuant to Public Act 188 of 1954, requires a public hearing and notice of said hearing;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that a public hearing shall be conducted upon the amendment of the special assessment roll, which hearing will be held at the Monitor Township Hall at 2483 East Midland Road, Bay City, Michigan, commencing at 7:00 p.m. on November 23, 2020.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Clerk and the Assessor shall prepare an Amended Assessment Roll which shall include all parcels necessary to be added and all parcels to be deleted from the Special Assessment Roll previously confirmed by this Board, and

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk shall mail notification to the owners of record of each parcel being added to or deleted from the special assessment roll, and publish notice two times in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township in a manner consistent with the notice requirements of Act 188 of 1954.
