- V. Begick, Co. Commissioner stated that the Animal Shelter bids were finalized today. A new building will be constructed at the fairgrounds, hopefully within a year, costing \$ 6 million. The county budget is finalizing soon.
- E. Arnold reported on the Shop with Heroes program that 3 firefighters attended with children. A smoke detector install program is available through the Fire Dept. The new radios are slowly coming in.
- B. Walsh explained that the rezoning of the Animal Clinic on Midland Road was denied rezoning. A Fairfield hotel is going in behind the Uno's 4 stories tall. Great response on the master plan survey from the public.

Supervisor - Shop with a Cop, Fraternal Order of Police assisted 30 kids in spending \$100 each and provided a food basket to each family too. The renovations on the board room are coming along. The township is having a Holiday lights contest again this year. The Herb Steih park project is getting started now, even though it is not frozen yet. A press release from Frito Lay is coming out on the \$15 million investment they made. The fire Chief is having a Narcon training for the office on the 19th at 1:00. It appears the Co. is in favor of supporting the DDA extension for 30 years. 3-mile road work is planned for 2024 and the Road Commission will be having public meetings about it in Feb. or March.
